Allen intercuts between the two renditions as Melinda creates havoc in both fictional worlds. Besides Mitchell, each story has its own ensemble cast: Will Ferrell , Amanda Peet , and Josh Brolin in the first, Chloe Sevigny , Jonny Lee Miller , and Chiwetel Ejiofor in the second. Barely holding it together for her four daughters (Alicia Witt, Keri Russell, Erika Christensen , and Evan Rachel Wood), Terry's period of adjustment is complicated by Denny Davies (Kevin Costner in his best role in years), a clumsily affable neighbor and retired baseball player who shares her love of the all-day cocktail hour.
