Writer/director Robert Shallcross's cinematic fable about recovering the lost art of living finds an elderly Italian (Pierrino Mascarino) paying a first-ever visit to his American nephew and his wife (Joe Mantegna and Anne Archer). Nino expects to be inspired by their life in a country he has always admired. But he is dismayed to discover a barely communicative family struggling to exist in a land of take-out food, manicured lawns, teen smoking, and processed vegetables. Changes are in order.
